### **ABOUT LIBRARY**

The CIIL Library was established in April 1970. It is a multimedia library possessing specialized collection in Indian Languages, Linguistics and allied areas like Anthropology, Education, Folklore, Literature, Philosophy, Religion, Literature, and Tribal Languages etc., Also, it is a network library covering the libraries of the Regional Language Centers (RLCs) at Bhubaneswar, Guwahati, Lucknow, Mysore, Patiala, Pune and Solon with it. The main objective of the library is to act as the national information centre on linguistics and Indian languages. The library was fully computerized during the tenth five year plan period under the Bhasha Bharathi Project. The Institute's library is the second in the country to have a fully digital library at the metadata level. Here is a computerized system that allows users to obtain coherent means of access to an organized, electronically stored repository of information at their work place itself. The digital library was formally inaugurated on May 5, 2005 by Sri B. S. Baswan, the then Education Secretary.

The Ministry of Human Resource Development has placed this library in Category IV, since Oct 31, 2006.

Prof. Ashok R. Kelkar and Late Prof. Probodh Narayan Singh have donated their collection of books.

The books on linguistics and its allied areas in this section are separated from Generalities to History section. More than 30,000 books are on different aspects of language and linguistics including tribal and foreign languages.

The books in Indian languages form a separate section. More than 12% of the collection is in Hindi followed by Bengali (7%) Tamil, Odia, Marathi, Kannada and other Languages.



#### Journal Section

Stack Section

The Institute subscribes to 83 international journals, 36 Indian journals/magazines and dailies, with 8000 back volumes of journals. Most of the professional journals on linguistics are in complete set. Current journals and the back issues are kept separately in the journal section with reading facility.



Online Public Access Catalog (OPAC) in the VTLS package has been done for all the journals. Comprehensive information about the journals is made available along with content list, abstracts, and full text for some issues of the journals.

# **E**-Journals

The back issues of some of the journals are now digitally available from its first volume. Important journals in CDs have been purchased. For example, Language, journal of the acoustical society of American.

#### **Browsing Section**

Users have access to daily newspapers and light reading magazine/news letters in different Indian Languages.

### Maps, Charts and Photographs

**Browsing Section** 

The library has restricted (1345) and unrestricted maps (1296), physical, geographical, language and political maps, world maps (30), atlases and globe, etc. These have been laminated and stored in maps cabinet. The charts and photographs represent the origin and developments of scripts, early printing and advertising. A web site and an exhaustive bibliography have been prepared.

#### Multimedia Section

All the audio and video CDs. tapes. etc., have been classified languagewise and arranged in this section. The infrastructure includes specially designed CD cabinets and each cabinet has the index of its holdings. A multimedia web page is created where in entire metadata of multimedia materials is available in a classified order.



Multimedia Section

Special collection includes: 1. Language text books from standard 1<sup>st</sup> to 10<sup>th</sup> in all Indian languages. 2. College level text books published by Granth academies on various subjects in major Indian languages. 3. Children's literature in major Indian languages and English. 4. Indian literature in translation. 5. Adult education and literacy primers. 6. Reprints, off prints and languages Act.

#### **Census Publication.** Gazetteer

Census publication from 1872 to 1951 in microfiche form and from 1961 totill-date are available in both print and CD format. The imperial gazetteer from 1895 to1962 is available in both print and microfiche form. The state assembly debates on language policies Karnataka, Maharashtra and Gujarat are available on microfiche.

The library has acquired 1286 theses and dissertations. Out of these, 424 are in book format (kept in reference section and are getting digitized), 356 in digitized format and 331 in microfilm format for which digitization has been completed.

Newspaper Clippings

Initiated from 1982 onwards, the library has collected and preserved clipping from all the national newspapers subscribed, in the areas of linguistics. Indian languages, language use in education, administration and mass media, language minorities, political issues and folklore etc. Approximately 30,000 clippings have been classified and maintained in different files. Meta data for clippings before 2000 is available in the VTLS with full text link and are made available in the newspaper clippings website. Non-Book Materials

Entire non-book collection has the OPAC like gramophone records, audio cassette tapes, film strips, slides, spools, etc. They have been digitized and made available.

#### Institution Repository

The intranet web page http://192.168.6.250/repository/index.html. Consists of full text research articles produced by the faculty of CIIL and its RLCs.

#### ERVICES

The services include from a conventional to digital information services. Reference/referral services, inter-library loan. Xerox. current awareness services, browsing, library orientation and access to online database for periodicals, etc., are some additional services.

#### Circulation Section

Online Public Access catalogue (OPAC) The OPAC is the getaway for searching the library bibliographic database. A search facility through web is available in its VTLS i Portal. It enables the user access worldwide for easy information retrieval. There are four types of searches such as Browse search, Keyword search, Heading keyword search and Expert search (for the library staff). Users can limit their searches to a particular type of document. The searched items can be saved in the cart for future reference. The location links shall take directly to the particular library/centers. Lexical interface to English, Hindi and Marathi is provided for dictionary help. Information retrieval thesaurus in Tamil will be included here. Patron can know the transaction details by entering the patron ID and password.

# **Conferencing Facilities**

A conference room with the capacity of 20 persons is made available with facilities, such as, computer with internet facility, LCD projector etc.
